1. PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

Clone: VIPL2;

Immunogen: The anti-CD61 monoclonal antibody derives from a cell suspension containing osteoclasts from osteoclastomas;

Large description: This antibody reacts with the CD61-antigen (GP11a), which is expressed on human platelets. The monoclonal antibody reacts with platelets, megakaryocytes, megakaryoblasts, endothelial cells, fibroblasts, smooth muscle cells and osteoblasts (integrin beta-3 chain) in complexed form and does not react with the platelets of patients with Glanzmann Thrombasthenia⁽⁶⁾.


